If you own a cat or Pit Bull-type dog, live in Baltimore County and receive government assistance, your pet could be spayed or neutered for **FREE!**

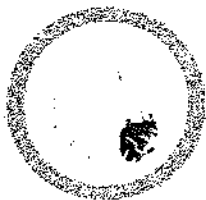
